A sample of 1,533 respondents was drawn from the adult population through a national multistage probability sampling method. Apoyo, Opinión y Mercados, S.A., among Peru’s best-known survey research organizations conducted the interviews face-to-face. Funding was generously supplied by The United States Agency for International Development (USAID).

The sample was self-weighted and was designed to be representative of the voting population in terms of gender, age and geographic distribution. The complete sample is composed of 49.4% male respondents and 50.6% female, and its estimated margin of error is  $\pm 2.5$  (at the 95% level).

Unlike most of the other LAPOP surveys, there is no country report presenting the results of this study. However, results were analyzed in a research study, “Democracy Participation in Peru”, written by Julio Carrión, Martín Tanaka, and Patricia Zárate.
