By the 1960s, Jackie moved north to Canada to escape the segregationist South. She became part of the Toronto Sound, a music movement heavily influenced by American R&B.

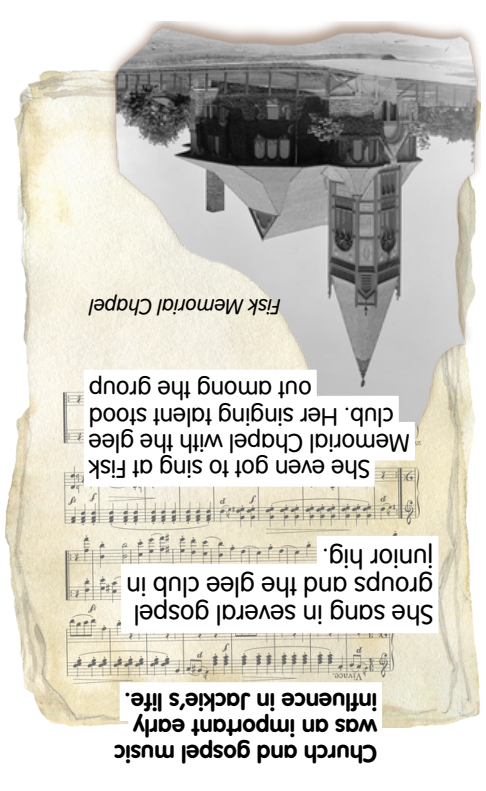
At the height of her fame, Jackie left the music industry by the early 1970s.



Her whereabouts were unknown for 40 years. Shane turned out to be living quietly in Nashville, Tennessee.



Jackie's musical career began in earnest when she was just a teenager. She became a regular part of the Excello/Nashboro studio band. She also played with a band at the New Era Club, a music venue in North Nashville's critical Black music scene.



Church and gospel music was an important early influence in Jackie's life. She sang in several gospel groups and the club in Junior High. She even got to sing at Fisk Memorial Chapel with the glee club. Her singing talent stood out among the group.

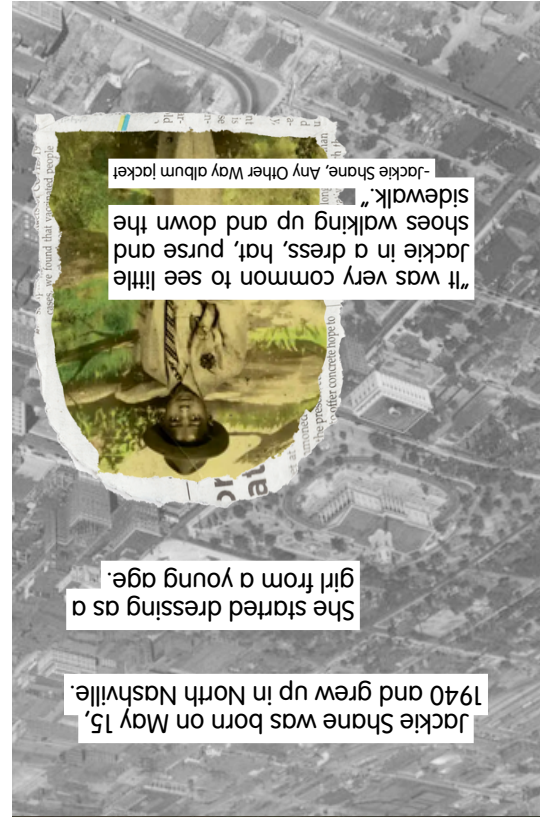

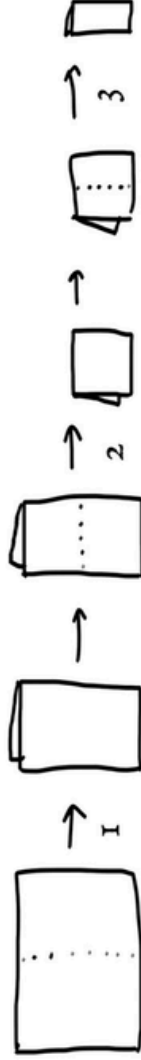

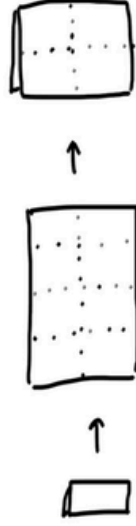
## Make a One-Page Zine



TAKE ONE SHEET OF PAPER AND FOLD IT IN HALF THREE TIMES...



UNFOLD IT ALL THE WAY, THEN RE-FOLD IT IN HALF LENGTH-WISE.



STARTING FROM THE FOLDED EDGE, CUT HALFWAY THROUGH THE PAPER.



FOLD THE PAGE IN HALF ALONG THE CUT. THEN, PRESS THE ENDS OF THE FOLDED PAGE INWARD TOWARD THE CENTER SO THE CUT SPLITS & OPENS. TO CREATE THE SPINE.
