THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The processional begins as the candidates for degrees march onto Alumni Lawn, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates move toward the platform from five directions.

I

Entering from the rear of the audience is the **College of Arts and Science**, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean Carolyn Dever, College of Arts and Science, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

II

Entering from the rear to the left of the audience are two schools: the **Law School** and the **School of Medicine**. They are led by:

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

Dean Bonnie M. Miller, School of Medicine, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of audiology, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of public health, master of science in clinical investigation, master of laboratory investigation, doctor of medical physics, master of medical physics, and doctor of medicine. Their banner has a green field.

III

Entering from the left of the audience near the platform is the **Graduate School** led by:

Vice Provost and Dean Dennis G. Hall, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field.

IV

Entering to the right of the audience are **Peabody College** and the **School of Nursing**. They are led by:

Dean Camilla P. Benbow, Peabody College, followed by the graduate faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, master of public policy, and bachelor of science. Their banner has a light blue field.

Dean Colleen Conway-Welch, School of Nursing, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of doctor of philosophy, doctor of nursing practice, and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

V

Entering from the rear to the right of the audience are four schools: the **Blair School of Music**, the **School of Engineering**, the **Divinity School**, and the **Owen Graduate School of Management**. They are led by:

Dean Mark Wait, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of music. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Philippe M. Fauchet, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean James Hudnut-Beumler, Divinity School, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of divinity and master of theological studies. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Dean James W. Bradford, Owen Graduate School of Management, followed by the faculty and the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

After the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a fanfare and the first part of the academic procession will enter from the back of the audience. The order is:

Provost Richard C. McCarty and Vice Chancellor Jeffrey R. Balsler leading in the professors emeriti and the faculty.

After the faculty have entered, another trumpet fanfare will sound, and the second part of the academic procession will enter. The order is:

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial “V” has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The current chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university’s authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The Chancellor’s insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder’s Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor’s degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt’s custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered “V” on the gown’s yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D. or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters’ hoods are edged with white for arts, golden yellow for science, salmon pink for public health, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

THE Nichols- Chancellor's MEDAL

The Nichols–Chancellor’s Medal is one of the university’s highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt’s Senior Class Day and carries a cash prize.

The 2013 Nichols–Chancellor’s Medal is presented to Nobel and Pulitzer Prize-winner Toni Morrison, a novelist whose works include *Beloved*, *Song of Solomon*, and *Jazz*. Born in Lorain, Ohio, she is a graduate of Howard University and earned her master’s degree from Cornell University. Morrison published her first novel, *The Bluest Eye*, in 1970. Her second, *Sula*, was nominated for an American Book Award.

She wrote two more novels (*Song of Solomon* and *Tar Baby*) before publishing *Beloved*, which won the 1988 Pulitzer Prize for fiction and was made into a film starring Oprah Winfrey. Her most recent novel is *Home*.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Robert George Tauscher, from Geneva Illinois, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. He is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

A double major in biological sciences and Spanish, Rob was elected to Sigma Delta Pi, the Spanish Honor Society, and received the Katharine B. Woodward Prize for Excellence in Spanish Studies. He was one of only 27 students selected, nationwide, as an American Collegiate Rowing Association First Team Academic All-American and was Vanderbilt's sole nominee from the Class of 2013 for a Rhodes Scholarship. Rob was one of two co-authors of a paper that is currently being reviewed for possible publication by the *American Journal of Political Science*. During the course of his work for the Mani+ project, which aims to reduce the incidence of malnutrition in Guatemala, Rob wrote a report on ways to reduce aflatoxin in Guatemalan peanuts; the Director of the UN International Rural Development Fund requested and received a copy of the report. Rob was one of seven students selected in their sophomore year for early admission to the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, and, in fall 2013, he will begin his studies there.

Shelby June Flowers, from Highlands Ranch, Colorado, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music degree in musical arts, as a piano major with a composition concentration.

Shelby's artistic energy and intellectual brilliance have exerted a far-reaching effect upon faculty and peers alike. She has received the Sue Brewer Songwriter's Award, the David Rabin Prize, the Margaret Branscomb Prize, the Martin Williams Prize for Writing, the Collaborative Arts Award, and the Confroy-Lijoi Award for Excellence in Jazz Performance. The piano and composition faculties at Blair have chosen Shelby to represent the best of their studios, notably for the London Exchange Program. Her fellow student composers elected her president of the Composers Forum, which has become, under her leadership, a vital community. Shelby's positive influence has been profound. She leaves us grateful and heartened by the richness of her mind and the diversity of her musical gifts. After graduation, she will pursue her work of ministry and music for Josiah Venture, an organization in the Czech Republic.

Curtis George Northcutt, from Lexington, Kentucky, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of science in computer science and mathematics.

In the last four years, Curtis has worked at NASA, GE, a National Science Foundation REU, Microsoft, and three research universities, and earned numerous awards including the NSF Graduate Fellowship, a Goldwater Scholarship, and the James Geddes Memorial Scholarship. He has devoted

himself to improving his community as a mathematics guest lecturer, student mentor, respected researcher, and president of Tau Beta Pi, the scholarship fraternity in engineering. Curtis has served the Vanderbilt and Nashville communities through the Vanderbilt Prison Project, Engineers Without Borders, and Vanderbilt Students Volunteering for Science. He was also commissioned a Kentucky Colonel, the highest civilian honor in Kentucky, for commitment to his community. Curtis will attend the Massachusetts Institute of Technology this fall to pursue a Ph.D. in computer science as an NSF fellow.

Jesse Mark Neugebauer, from Gering, Nebraska, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College of Education and Human Development. He is graduating with a bachelor of science in early childhood education and special education.

Jesse graduates with licensure in early childhood education and special education, having received national commendation for outstanding performance on the Praxis exam. Jesse has been on the Dean's List for every eligible semester. He is a Peabody Scholar, a Carell Scholar, a member of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars, and a member of Kappa Delta Pi, the international honor society for education. Jesse has served as a three-year member of Vanderbilt's Wishmakers and the coordinator for his Mayfield Living Learning Lodge's program distributing resources to children in need. An exemplary teacher and a two-time cancer survivor, Jesse has demonstrated his commitment to serving the highest-need students through his exceptional performance in high-risk communities in the United States and the Dominican Republic. Jesse has been offered positions in classrooms around the world and is deciding where he may be of most use.

Frank Eugene Lilley, Jr., from Clinton, Mississippi, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. He is graduating with a master of divinity.

Frank received the Goodwin Prize for Excellence in Theological Writing, a VDS Imagination Grant, and the George Mitchell Scholarship. He was also named a Cal Turner Leadership Scholar. Frank's experience in Professor Douglas Meeks' "God, the Economy, and Poverty" class at Riverbend Maximum Security Institute helped to form him vocationally and encouraged him to combine scholarship with action. Frank describes his most meaningful service experiences during his time at Vanderbilt as having been "in my work at City Road Chapel UMC. What I have loved there is seeing a congregation grow in the way it sees its discipleship as connected to its love for its community." He will be moving this summer to Mississippi to pursue ordination in the United Methodist Church. In the future, he hopes to engage in graduate studies in theology. She was an active member of the Student Advisory Committee and involved in the Finance, Operations, and Culinary Clubs. The first member of her family to earn a graduate degree, Lan was recently inducted into Beta Gamma Sigma International Honor Society, signifying academic excellence. Last summer, Lan was a senior financial advisor intern at Dell, Inc., in Healthcare & Life Sciences Finance in Round Rock, Texas. After graduation, Lan plans to return to Singapore to be with her husband and pursue a career in business and quantitative analytics.

Angela Lee Bergman, from Brookfield, Wisconsin, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Law School. She is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

A Chancellor's Scholar, Angela received numerous academic awards, including Dean's List in all semesters, the Scholastic Excellence Award for the highest academic performance in two classes (Criminal Law and Corporations), and the Law Review Editor's Award, awarded to the third-year editorial board member who has made the most significant contribution to the *Vanderbilt Law Review*. Working in Geneva, Switzerland, for an NGO group that supported the rights of the child, Angela recognized a passion and a responsibility to protect and serve those whose status, gender, or life circumstances deny them equal protection under the law. Her time working in the Office of the Public Defender of the U.S. Department of State in Washington, D.C., solidified her commitment to public service. After Commencement, Angela will be a first-year associate with Bass Berry & Sims, in Nashville, Tennessee.

Lindsay Satterwhite Mayberry, from Lexington, Kentucky, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Graduate School. She is graduating with a doctor of philosophy in community research and action.

Lindsay participated in a Kennedy Center training program, served as an expert witness for a district court case, and published eight manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals and one book chapter. She received the Newbrough Award for best paper by a student and a postdoctoral National Research and Science Award from the National Institutes of Health.

She was also the recipient of the Irwin Eskind Vanderbilt Scholar in Diabetes Award from the Vanderbilt Diabetes Research and Training Center. Lindsay is currently a post-doctoral research trainee at the Vanderbilt University Medical Center in the Division of Internal General Medicine and Public Health with support from a National Research and Service Award from the National Institutes of Health. She is developing skills and expanding the research base on the role of family in management and prevention of type 2 diabetes in adults and children in creation of a framework for family-based community interventions.

Chaquetta Thomas Johnson, from Alexandria, Louisiana, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Nursing. She is graduating with a doctor of nursing practice.

Growing up in small Alabama town, Chaquetta witnessed the difficulties of living in poverty and the consequences of poor choices by people in the community. She realized she wanted to be a nurse at a very early age, so she could use her skills and knowledge to improve the world around her. While earning her D.N.P., Chaquetta secured a childhood obesity prevention grant and co-chaired a health and disparities forum. Her scholarly work on birth control methods and their relation to sexually transmitted diseases resulted in a more efficient and effective reproductive health clinic model that was implemented statewide in Louisiana in 2012. Chaquetta has received numerous academic honors including the Lulu K. Wolf Hasenplug Scholarship, the Nightingale Award for DNP Students, and election to the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing. As the regional consultant, overseeing nine health departments, she will implement evidence-based practice in the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals.

William Michael Sullivan, from Massapequa, New York, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Medicine. He is graduating with a doctor of medicine and a master of education.

Billy is the first Vanderbilt student to pursue joint M.D. and M.Ed. degrees. He notes, "Being an academic physician is the perfect opportunity for me to engage both students and patients as learners. In seeking to develop rigorous expertise as an educator, the decision to pursue a master's degree in education after my third year of medical school was a natural one." 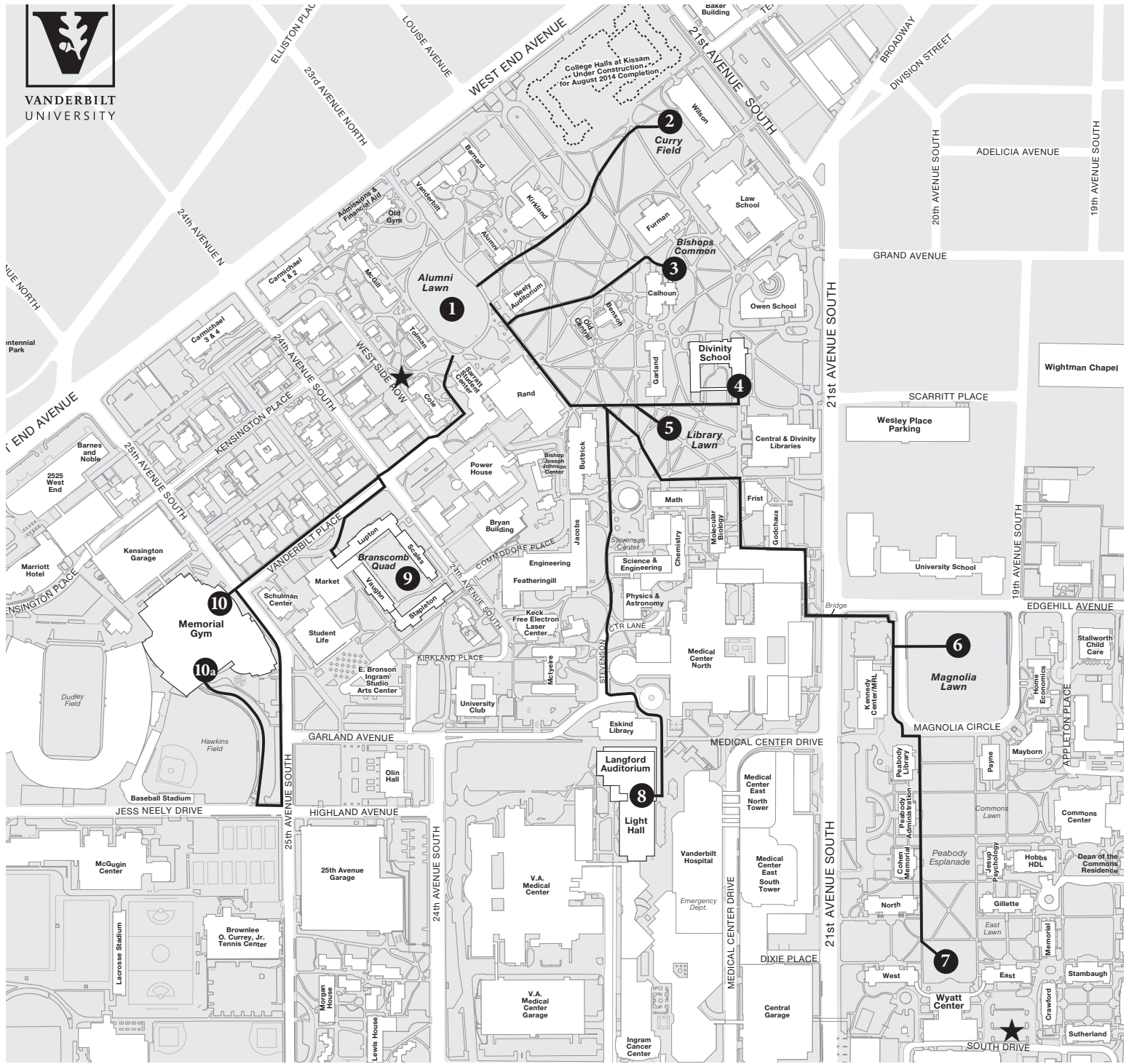
