I would like to announce a **call for applications for the Early Career Award** for the 2025 Association of Clinical and Translational Statisticians (ACTStat) Annual Meeting. The purpose of the Early Career Award is to recognize the meritorious works and achievements of an early career individual among us that has provided substantial support to team clinical or translational science through the practice of statistics. Those within seven years of their terminal degree are eligible to apply for the Early Career Award, and this award is not limited to faculty (e.g., those in industry, government, etc., are also eligible). The Early Career Award winner will be invited to present their work as a talk at the annual meeting and will receive a \$250 honorarium.

Demonstrate what you have done that has contributed to team science!

- In addition to an abstract please also include a statement of how your work has made an impact in supporting team and/or translational science, along with a resume, biosketch, or CV. (Past recipients of the Early Career Award are no longer eligible, but are encouraged to submit their new work for consideration as a poster presentation.)

To submit a packet for the Early Career Award, email your materials to president_elect@actstat.org.

The meeting this year will be held in Nashville, TN this year on August 2nd and 3rd just prior to the Joint Statistical Meetings. The Early Career Award winner will be selected by a committee assembled by the president elect of ACTStat.

The deadline for submission is Friday, April 18, 2025.

The 2025 ACTStat Annual Meeting provides an excellent opportunity to network with researchers interested in enhancing the design, implementation, and analysis of clinical and translational studies. Highlights of the 2025 ACTStat meeting will include:

- presentations from leading biostatisticians in clinical and translational science,
- networking opportunities to connect with peers and mentors, including a networking dinner on Saturday, August 2nd, and
- many other activities to foster professional development.
