



## *Costa Rica 1987: Mass Sample*

This study was conducted in the months of May and June of 1987. The data were collected from face-to-face, in home interviews. The total N of 927 was obtained from a national probability multistage sample. The sampling frame was the 1984 national population census and produced eighty-five primary sampling units stratified into nine strata and distributed throughout all of Costa Rica's seven provinces. The survey was conducted by the Universidad de Costa Rica under the supervision of Miguel Gómez Barrantes, and designed by Mitchell A. Seligson.
