






NINA BUTTERNUT

Nina Butternut came to us from a hoarding/cruelty case in Arkansas. Nina lived in a solitary outdoor kennel in the elements. As soon as we opened her makeshift “kennel”, she crawled to our team member and they carried her to her new home at NHA. Nina was safe now, but she had a long road ahead of her. She was heartworm positive. She had to learn to trust. It took time for her to simply get used to human touch. But she got there.

Ultimately, Nina was in our care for 210 days or approximately seven months. During that time she learned that whipped cream tastes amazing. She learned that chicken nugget car rides are the best car rides. And she learned that most people are actually pretty nice.

MEDICAL WORK

Nashville Humane's medical team had an eventful year in 2021. From 725 medical procedures, ranging from tumor removal to amputations, to more than 2,700 spay/neuter surgeries, it's because of the generous gifts of NHA supporters that we're able to say 'yes' to hundreds of different pets who may not have had a second chance in other situations.

CHIHUAHUA RESCUE



Early in 2021, we were contacted to assist with an animal cruelty case about 90 minutes south of Nashville. We coordinated with local Lincoln and Giles County law enforcement to rescue 11 chihuahuas and numerous cats that were all living in horrific conditions. Upon arrival we found frightened dogs, many appeared not to have had positive human contact in a long time.

While they needed weeks of recovery and support from our medical team, their future was ultimately bright and now they're all in loving homes. With particularly difficult cases like this, it's best for our team to focus on how we will be helping them, not what we're witnessing. In all, we supported 9 animal cruelty/hoarding cases in 2021, helping more than 170 animals restore their faith in people.

ROAD WARRIORS

TRANSPORT PROGRAM

The Transport Program at Nashville Humane allows us to assist local urban, rural and regional shelters who may have overpopulation or resource issues. When we're able to stretch our arms out, we can not only reach those pets in need in our backyard, but also pets in need across the globe. From scheduled transports, to emergency assists, our Transport Program helps make furry dreams come true.



MAYFIELD TORNADOES

In early December, a series of devastating tornadoes ripped through the midwest and southeast. One particular town in Kentucky, Mayfield, was almost completely leveled. Just a few hours north of Nashville, the minute we were given an “all clear” to enter the city, we were at Mayfield-Graves Animal Shelter, helping support the people and pets who had lost nearly everything to the tragic storms.

In all, through three transports, we were able to bring nearly 100 pets out of harm’s way and into a new beginning in middle Tennessee. All of that is made possible through our Transport Program. From scheduled transports, to local shelter pickups, to natural disaster support, NHA’s Transport Program goes a long way so homeless pets can find their way to a new home.


SAFETY NET



TEMPORARY CARE

When an emergency happens or a crisis strikes, sometimes there just aren't available options for pet-families. Many of these families are forced to "give up" their furry family members due to hospitalization, natural disaster, or situations of domestic violence. Temporary Care, also known as crisis fostering, is one of the programs we offer to help keep animals in their homes by giving short-term solutions and access to resources for pet families.

When you're struggling with a massive challenge in life, the last thing you want to have to worry about is "what's going to happen to my pet?" Our pets are our families. Temporary Care pets like Fiona, Ella, and Charlie were able to spend a short time in one of Nashville Humane's loving foster homes, and that allowed their people time and peace-of-mind to know their pet was safe.

Wiley was a popular dog, but that doesn’t always mean instant adoption. Special dogs sometimes require special homes and not everyone had the right home for Wiley. He loved playtime with other dogs, but he really wanted to live alone.

Ultimately, Wiley would become our longest stay resident across 2020-2021. He would last in our program for 344 days. Longterm adoptions require time, energy and resources. Because we have a strong network of support, that means dogs like Wiley are afforded the chance to find their match. He just needed a little time. Once the right family found him, it was love at first sight and no turning back for this smiling little boy!

what is a foster ambassador?

Foster Ambassadors are a special type of foster who go the extra mile to help hard-to-place pets find their forever someones. Foster Ambassadors are part trainer, part pet publicist, and ALL hero. Foster Ambassadors take pets who have struggled to find their way, give them a relaxing home environment to live, help them learn pet skills, and promote them on social media.



We knew Nikki was going to touch our hearts from the moment we saw her at the local municipal shelter here in Nashville. Ultimately, Nikki found her perfect match with Alyssa, a Nashville Humane foster and volunteer. Alyssa specializes in supporting our scared and undersocialized kittens and

cats. As a specialized volunteer, she was the perfect match for Nikki Nugget and it didn't take very long after Alyssa began fostering, for their match to become a forever bond. As Alyssa continues to support our kitten and cat program, Nikki has now earned "junior foster" status!

Nannoo now thrives as a member of the "Puckett Family" living out her best days enjoying stroller rides, scratches and scratches, and of course, love and companionship with her human and furry family.

TIPPY



Tippy was found in a drain by a good Samaritan. Tippy's prognosis was grim, as it appeared that someone had maliciously attempted to remove her paws. Once in our care, our medical team immediately worked to stabilize Tippy and began the process of accessing the wounds on all four of his feet. A plan was quickly hatched to provide her the best possible care, and that her life was worth saving. After numerous surgeries and procedures, and several weeks in our ICU, Tippy was able to make it out alive.


Tippy was able to receive this care thanks to our Emergency Medical Fund. NHA's Emergency Medical Fund was created to provide a lifeline for pets whose medical diagnosis, under other circumstances, may have been fatal. We work to set aside resources so that we can be the option of last resort for some pets who have no other direction to turn.

Tippy benefited from our Emergency Medical Fund. Because of generous shelter supporters, Tippy was able to make it through her surgeries, thrive in her foster home, and now she looks forward to a full recovery and ultimately adoption sometime in early 2022!
